COUNTY	COUNTY MULTIPLIERS	ANNUAL/WEEKLY FEE
In <b>Cattaraugus, Columbia, Genesee, Greene, Livingston, Steuben, Tioga</b> and <b>Washington</b> counties	parents pay <b>10%</b> of their income over the poverty level for a child care subsidy	this means they pay <b>\$2172</b> per year, or <b>\$41.77</b> per week (5% of their income)
In, <b>Oswego, Schuyler</b> and <b>St. Lawrence</b> counties	parents pay <b>15%</b> of their income over the poverty level for a child care subsidy	this means they pay <b>\$3528</b> per year, or <b>\$67.85</b> per week (7.5% of their income)
In <b>Allegany, Cayuga, Chautauqua, Chenango, Clinton, Columbia, Dutchess, Essex, Monroe, Nassau, Niagara, Ontario, Orange, Otsego, Putnam, Saratoga, Seneca, Suffolk, Tompkins</b> and <b>Yates</b> counties	parents pay <b>20%</b> of their income over the poverty level for a child care subsidy	this means they pay <b>\$4344</b> per year, or <b>\$83.54</b> per week (10% of their income)
In <b>Albany, Broome, Chemung, Delaware, Franklin, Fulton, Hamilton, Herkimer, Jefferson, Lewis, Madison, Montgomery, Oneida, Rensselaer, Rockland, Schenectady, Sullivan, Ulster, Warren, Washington, Wayne,</b> and <b>Wyoming</b> counties	parents pay <b>25%</b> of their income over the poverty level for a child care subsidy	this means they pay <b>\$5430</b> per year, or <b>\$104.42</b> per week (12.5% of their income)
In <b>Westchester</b> County	parents pay <b>27%</b> of their income over the poverty level for a child care subsidy	this means they pay <b>\$5864</b> per year, or <b>\$112.77</b> per week (13.5% of their income)
In <b>Schoharie</b> County	parents pay <b>30%</b> of their income over the poverty level for a child care subsidy	this means they pay <b>\$6516</b> per year, or <b>\$125.31</b> per week (15% of their income)
In <b>Cortland, Erie, New York City,</b> and <b>Onondaga</b> counties	parents pay <b>35%</b> of their income over the poverty level for a child care subsidy	this means they pay <b>\$7602</b> per year, or <b>\$146.19</b> per week (17.5% of their income)
