Were You Injured During a Rochester Protest, but Don't Have Health Insurance?

If you need health coverage and are at the hospital, or have unpaid bills, you have the right to ask for their "charity care" policy. Hospitals have funds to cover services for those who are uninsured, regardless of immigration status, on a sliding scale basis up to 300% of the federal poverty level, or \$38,280 for a household of 1. You may also be required to also submit a Medicaid application at this time.

- Hospitals cannot send account to collections while a charity care application is pending.
- Patients must receive notice 30 days prior to referral to collection.
- If you are found to be eligible for Medicaid, collection cannot commence on any outstanding debt resulting from services provided when you applied.
- Hospitals must require any contracted collections agencies to comply with the hospital's financial assistance (charity care) policy. If your case was referred to collections, collections agencies must also provide information on charity care, and how to apply.
