

# HAVE YOU RECEIVED YOUR COVID-19 FEDERAL STIMULUS MONEY?



If not, you may still be eligible for a \$1200 payment for yourself and \$500 for each of your children.

## DON'T MISS OUT!

You may have to apply directly to the IRS to receive your CARES Act stimulus money (also called "recovery rebates" or "economic impact payments")

## NOT JUST FOR WORKERS

You may be eligible even if you didn't work much, or at all, in 2018 and 2019.

## PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

You may be eligible even if you received SNAP benefits (food stamps), Medicaid, or public assistance (SNA or TANF) during 2018 or 2019.

## BEFORE YOU APPLY

- Gather your **personal information**, including your legal name, address, date of birth, Social Security Number, e-mail address and phone number.
- If you have **children**, make sure you have their name(s), Social Security Number(s) or Adoption Taxpayer Identification Number(s), and how they are related to you.
- If you have a **bank account**, make sure you know if it's a checking or savings account, your account number, and the bank's routing number.
- If you've filed taxes before, make sure you have your **IRS PIN number**. If you've forgotten your PIN you can go to <https://www.irs.gov/identity-theft-fraud-scams/get-an-identity-protection-pin> to find it.

## TO APPLY

- Go to the IRS website at <https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus/non-filers-enter-payment-info-here>.
- **Create an account** with your email address and phone number.
- Enter your **bank account information** (if you don't have a bank account you will get a check or a pre-paid card in the mail).
- Enter your **driver's license** (or **state-issued ID**) information. If you don't have one, leave it blank.

## AFTER YOU HAVE APPLIED

- You'll receive an e-mail from "**Customer Service at Free File Fillable Forms.**" It will tell you if your application is complete or how to correct any problems.
- **You will receive your stimulus money.**



## YOUR STIMULUS FUNDS WILL:

- Count as a resource for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) after one year.
- Count as a resource for Public Assistance after two months.
- Be used to pay for overdue child support.
- **NOT** affect your immigration status or make you a "public charge."
- **NOT** count against you as income for Public Assistance, Medicaid, SNAP (Food Stamps), Supplemental Security Income
